

MURPHRY, HENRY D.

1904-April 4, 1932

Henry Murphy, 53-year old Cassa resident, was found dead in the middle of a road, near his home, Tuesday morning, by his neighbor, Mr. Ingles. Ingles was looking for some of his stock and noticed a bunch of horses acting queer a short distance away and upon investigation, discovered the body in the road.

According to the information, Murphy, who lives north of the river from Cassa, had left Monday night for the M. Barton ranch to deliver a message. He was riding a bicycle, and it is thought he suffered a sudden heart attack and fell from his bicycle as he reached the top of the hill. Bert Richards, coroner, was notified, and after investigation, pronounced death being caused from leakage of the heart. As near as could be learned, Murphy's death occurred about 6:30 Monday night.

The deceased had suffered with heart trouble since 12 years of age at which time he had rheumatism. On the day of his death he was forced to stop work of loading potatoes because of his heart.

Murphy was living with his brother, Lawrence, and was a single man. He is also survived by an aunt in Evansville, Ill., and an uncle in Sprague, Wash.

Funeral services will be held from the Longwith-Richards Funeral Home Friday afternoon at 2:30. Cecil V. Smith, pastor of the Christian church will perform the last rites and he will be buried in the Wheatland cemetery.
