

NAFFZIGER, LUCINDA GOLDSMITH

1858-January 7, 1944

Mrs. Lucinda Naffziger, 85, passed away at 5:15 a.m. Friday morning, January 7, after an illness of two months.

She was a pioneer of Wyoming having come here as a young woman in 1883 with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Peter Goldsmith who settled on Bear Creek about 35 miles north of Cheyenne.

In 1888 she was married to David Naffziger of Wheatland, Mo. where she went to live. They later lived in several states until settling in northern Colorado where Mr. Naffziger died in 1907.

For the past twenty years, she has made her home with her daughter, Mrs. Evie J. Soward and her sister, Mrs. G.W. Brandon in Wheatland.

She is survived by three children, William D. of Minneapolis, Minn., Joseph P. of Parsons, Kan. and Mrs. Evie J. Soward of Wheatland; and three sisters, Mrs. G.W. Brandon of Wheatland, Mrs. John J. Craig of Olympia, Wash., and Mrs. B.F. Guy of Cheyenne.

Services were held at 2 p.m. Sunday, January 9, from the Copley Funeral Home in Wheatland, the Rev. C.S. Higby officiating, and burial was in the Wheatland cemetery.
