

NOBLE, MARGARET BERRY  
November 12, 1861-March 18, 1931

Mrs. Glyde Noble, 69-year old Wheatland resident, passed away at 2 a.m. Wednesday morning after being confined to her bed the past 11 weeks. Mrs. Noble fell, while on her way to her son's home, and broke her hip. Since that time, she has gradually failed in health.

Funeral services are being held this afternoon from the Congregational church at 2 o'clock with Rev. R.E. Morgan of that church performing the last rites, and burial is being made in the Wheatland cemetery.

Margaret Berry was born in Muscatine, Iowa, November 12, 1861. When a young girl, she left there for Illinois with her parents and then came to Nebraska. In November 1894, she, with her family, moved to Wheatland and has lived here since that time. She was married in 1880 to J.L. Dearing who preceded her in death in 1893. To this union three sons were born, F.T. Dearing, H.E. Dearing and Sherman Dearing, all of them business men of Wheatland. In 1908, she was united in marriage to Glyde Noble, who survives her. Aside from her sons and husband, she is survived by four sisters, Dora Quasdorf of Daws, Iowa; Lydia Scott, Hoquiam, Wash.; Ella Reed, Des Moines, Iowa; and Laura White, Belfair, Wash.; and two brothers, G.E. Berry of Nampa, Idaho and C.E. Berry, Kalispell, Mont.; five grandchildren. Two brothers, Wm. F. Berry and John Berry and one sister, Katie Reed, preceded her in death.
