

Albert Joseph Noe

August 26, 1926 – December 1, 2010

A military graveside service and inurnment for Albert Joseph Noe, 84, will be conducted at 1:00 P.M., Friday, December 17, 2010, in the Wheatland Cemetery at Wheatland, Wyoming, with military rites accorded by American Legion Post #10 and Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #3558. A memorial service will also be held at 10:00 A.M. on Monday, December 20, 2010, at the Platte County Memorial Nursing Home in Wheatland.

Mr. Noe, a long time resident of Wheatland died Wednesday, December 1, 2010, at the Platte County Memorial Nursing Home where he was cared for by the nurses and volunteers for 14 years.

Albert was born August 26, 1926, in Long Pine, Nebraska, the son of David Albert and Leenno Katherine (Wick) Noe. It was at the nursing home that you could see his big blue eyes, his "flirting" heart and his smiling face. If you visited with him, it's likely that you would have been beat in an arm wrestle. It was there that you would have also seen his framed article of his proud father Dave and the "Seven Fight-

ing Noe Brothers". Albert was the youngest of seven brothers that fought in World War II.

Survivors include a brother, Julian of Navarre, Florida; step-son, William Badon and wife, Teresa of Arbutus, Maryland; four sons, Albert Jr. and wife, Brenda Beck of Centrahoma, Oklahoma, Bruce and wife, Robin of Atlanta, Georgia, Vincent and wife, Helen of Arapaho, Oklahoma, Bobby and wife, Jozelle of Brawley, California, three daughters, Janet Shelley and husband, Thomas of Millsap, Texas, Jennifer Katzenberger and husband, Jason of Glen Burnie, Maryland and Cindy Kemp and husband, Ryan of Brawley, California; 31 grandchildren; and 13 great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents and seven brothers, Leo, Edward, James, Paul, Francis, Hugh, and Timothy.
