He attended schools in Davis County, Utah and attended Weber State University where he was a member of the wrestling squad. Mr. Page married Dorothy Elizabeth Robinson on December 30, 1938, in Wheatland. He and his wife made their home in Wheatland, where he managed the International Harvester farm equipment dealership until his retirement in 1988. He was active in community affairs in Wheatland and Platte County. He was a past president of the Lion's Club and active in the Chamber of Commerce. One of his greatest interests was water development. He was a Board Member of the Wheatland Irrigation District and served as its Chairman for 20 years. He was also a member of the Wyoming Water Development Commission, the National Rivers and Harbors Congress and the Four States Irrigation Council. He was a proud recipient of the Four States Irrigation Council Mr. Page was an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and served many years as Branch President in Wheatland, and later as a High Councilman. He was an avid outdoorsman and enjoyed fly-fishing, golfing, and hunting. He spent many wonderful hours at the family mountain cabin. In his later years, music and his grandchildren gave him much enjoyment.
