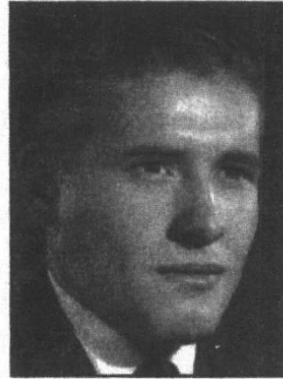


Roy Wayne Probst

Roy "Wayne" Probst, age 64, passed away on April 30, 2008 at the Cheyenne Health Care Center in Cheyenne, Wyo.
