Richard C. "Dick" Pulver⁶⁻¹⁻¹⁹⁷⁹ passed away Friday, June 1, 1979, at Platte County Memorial Hospital at the age of 81. Services were held Tuesday, June 5, 1979, at the First Christian Church with Daniel Barcus officiating. Burial was at the Wheatland Cemetery.

Serving as pallbearers were Frank Rumsey, Manuel Rodriguez, Bob Newkirk, Richard Nutt, Pete Delgado, and Bobby Clark. Schrader-Prell Funeral Home was in charge of the arrangements. A memorial has been established to the First Christian Church.

A resident here since 1918, Dick was born in Fall River, Wisconsin October 14, 1897. Dick homesteaded along Fish Creek when he came to this area.

He and Annabel C. Clark were married June 25, 1921 at the Congregational Church in Wheatland. They lived on the ranch until 1946 when they moved to town.

Dick did odd jobs around town until failing health prevented him from working. He was a member of the First Christian Church.

He is survived by his wife, Annabel, of Wheatland; two sons, James of Glendo and Milton of Santa Barbara, Calif.; one brother, Harry of Vancouver, Wa.; two sisters, Neva Miller of Wheatland and Grace McAdams of San Diego, Calif.; 20 grandchildren and 27 great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by one daughter, Helen Shafer; one brother, one sister, three great grandsons and two great granddaughters.
