

RILEY, ADOLPHUS DEFOREST

June 10, 1871-August 28, 1957

Final rites, conducted by Rev. J. B. Milstead were held at 2 o'clock Saturday, August 31 in the Schrader chapel for Adolphus DeForest Riley, 86 who died in Casper August 28 after an extended illness. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery.

Pallbearers were M. L. Coleman, Ross Donaldson, William Sutherland, Richard Butner, Ed Foreman and Harry Coleman.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Enoch Riley, he was born June 10, 1871 at Avoca, Ia., coming to Casper many years ago and to Wheatland and Dwyer in 1901.

The first five years of his residence in the community, he worked on the Pathfinder dam, moving in 1906 to a homestead where he ranched until his retirement. For the past year and a half, he had made his home in Casper.

His marriage to Martha Riley occurred November 29, 1906.

He leaves two sons, Richard of Dwyer and Truman of Casper; a daughter, Mrs. R. E. Goering of Casper; eight grandchildren and six great grandchildren.

Mrs. Riley died July 29, 1954.

GOODRICH, ELEANOR HUTCHESON

November 7, 1925-February 4, 1957

In a highway collision early Saturday evening a few miles north of Lusk, Eleanor Hutcheson (Mrs. William W.) Goodrich, 31, was fatally injured, death occurring at 10:30 p.m. Wednesday, September 4 at the Memorial hospital in Lusk.

The body was returned today to the Schrader Funeral home in Wheatland and services will be held at All Saints Episcopal church at 11 o'clock Saturday morning. In lieu of flowers, friends may contribute to the church memorial fund.

Pallbearers will be Harold Garrett, John Wilhelm, Jr., Emerson Utter, Homer Hoffman, James Archie and A.B. Wise.

She leaves her husband; two daughters, Nancy, 9 and Susan, 7; a son, Ralph, 2; her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Alex Hutcheson of Elmira, N.Y. and a brother, Ralph of Oakland, N.J.

Mrs. Goodrich was a graduate of Keuka college at Keuka Park, N. Y. majoring in sociology, and married in her junior year, her husband remaining in the east while she finished her education. The two then came to Wyoming for the completion of Mr. Goodrich's education and following this they engaged in ranching northwest of Wheatland. She was a member of O.E. S. Chapter Number 11, and the All Saints Episcopal church. She was a lover of music, being a talented pianist.

The Goodriches and their children were en route home Saturday from a month's trip to New York, where they visited the Hutchesons. They were traveling in the family "chuck wagon", but had met Miss Viola Skurdell on the return, and Mrs. Goodrich, Nancy and Ralph were riding with her in her car when another vehicle on the highway collided with them head on.

Miss Skurdell, who taught for three years in the Goodrich school, was also hospitalized in Lusk, but was moved Tuesday evening to the Wheatland General hospital where her condition was reported Wednesday as satisfactory.

August 13, 1895-March 20, 1957

Last rites for Mrs. A. N. Nelson, 61 of Wheatland will be held Friday, March 22, at 2 p.m. in the Congregational church with the Rev. E. D. Forssell officiating.

Mrs. Nelson died March 20 at a local hospital following an extended illness.

She was born August 13, 1895 to Soren and Maren Olsen in the state of Wisconsin and had resided since 1922 in Wheatland where for several years she was a registered nurse at the Wheatland General Hospital

Mr. and Mrs. Nelson Were married July 5, 1925 in Jackson, Wyo.

Mrs. Nelson was a registered nurse and had been employed in the Wheatland General hospital for many years until failing health forced her retirement. She was an active worker in the Congregational church where she taught Sunday school a number of years.

Mrs. Nelson will lie in state at the Schrader chapel until 12:30 p.m. Friday. Burial will be in the Wheatland cemetery.

Survivors include her husband, A. N. Nelson of Wheatland; two daughters, Mrs. Kenneth Bohl of Cheyenne and Mrs. Jerry Sparks of Laramie; two brothers, R. G. Olsen, Tacoma, Wash. And Nerls Olsen, Sidney, Mont.; one sister, Mrs. Mary Christensen and one grandchild.
