

RILEY, TRUMAN LEE
November 2, 1914-May 18, 1961

Truman Lee Riley, former Wheatland resident, was found dead in his apartment in Casper on May 19. He had been in ill health for some time.

Born at Dwyer on November 2, 1914, he attended the Wheatland schools and moved to Casper 18 years ago, where he was employed as a painter. He was affiliated with the Moose Lodge. His father, A.D. Riley, passed away in 1957, and his mother, Martha B. Riley, died in 1954.

Funeral services were conducted from the Schrader Chapel May 23, at 2:00 p.m., with Rev. Forrest Upchurch in charge of the last rites. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery with Ross Donaldson, Harry Coleman, Claude Donaldson, Richard Butner, Marvin Randall and Charles McAuley, acting as pallbearers.

The deceased is survived by two daughters, Donna and Carol Riley, both of Casper; one brother, Richard Riley of Dwyer and one sister, Mrs. R.E. Goering of Casper.
