

SATER, ARDITH MONROE
March 9, 1912-April 21, 1960

Funeral services were conducted from the Christian Church Saturday at 2:00 p.m. for Ardith Monroe Sater. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery with Masonic services at the graveside. Pallbearers were Ralph Poe, Jim McQuisten, Bill Dannar, Herbert Percy, Ralph Cotton and John Baker.

Ardith Monroe Sater was born March 9, 1912 in Woodburn, Iowa and passed away at Platte Memorial hospital on April 21, 1960 at the age of 48 years, 1 month and 12 days.

When he was two years of age, his parents moved to Douglas where he grew to manhood. He attended Douglas schools.

It was at Douglas, on July 8, 1939, that Martha Black became his bride and faithful wife. To this union, two daughters were born, one dying at birth.

Later he attended a jewelry and watchmaking school, and in 1940, Ardith and his wife moved to Wheatland where he went to work for the Buechner Drug and Jewelry as a watch repair man. When the Buechner Drug and Jewelry sold out to Bob Straw, he continued to work for them. From there, he went to work for the North Central Gas Company, where he had been employed the last eleven years.

He was a member of the York Rite Masonry and the Odd Fellows. He was also active in the Fire Department and other civil affairs. Nearly everyone in the community knew "Ardie" as he was affectionately called, and liked him for his cheery disposition and friendly nature. His ready smile and kind words were always appreciated by all.

He is survived by his wife, Martha, one daughter, Ardith, two sisters, Mrs. Viola Anthony of Cheyenne and Mrs. (?) Ballos of Douglas, one niece, Judy Ballos of Douglas; three nephews, Douglas and Udean Anthony of Douglas, and Rick Anthony of Casper, other relatives and many friends of Wheatland.
