Services for Scott Allen Schuldies were held at 2 p.m. in the Wheatland high School Auditorium, Nov. 28, with Dan Barcus officiating. He died from injuries sustained in an auto accident near Moneta on Nov. 25.

Schuldies was born in Wheatland Aug. 9, 1966, the son of Gene and Phyllis Schuldies. He was reared and educated in Wheatland, graduating from high school in May of 1984.

He was active in football and wrestling in high school, and was wrestling at Northwest Community College in Powell where he was majoring in Biology.

He was affiliated with the First Christian Church in Wheatland.

Besides his parents he is survived by two brothers, Nathan and Todd Schuldies, both of Wheatland; his paternal grandparents, Henry and Clara Schuldies of Wheatland; and his maternal grandparents, John and Dorothy Lissman of Lyman, Neb.

Car accident claims two local young men

A fatal car crash last Sunday claimed the lives of two young men from Wheatland.

Allen Schuldies and Andrew Flynn, both returning to Northwest Community College in Powell after celebrating a giving break with their families in Wheatland, when the accident occurred.

Weather had reportedly caused unsafe driving conditions in central and northern Wyoming Sunday.

Two youths were westbound at approximately 3:45 a.m. in a late-model Ford Pinto near Moneta, about half way between Wheatland and Powell, according to sources at the scene.

The Pinto apparently went out of control on the icy surface and skidded broadside in the path of an eastbound Galaxy driven by Leo

Barcus, resident of Powder River, age 32, was listed in

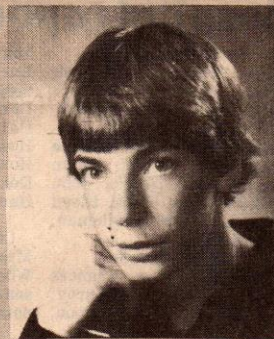

in a satisfactory condition by hospital authorities at Memorial Hospital of Natrona County as of Tuesday.

The force of the collision reportedly tore out the motor compartment of the Pinto. The front end of the Galaxy went almost all the way through the smaller car, according to a witness at the scene.

Schuldies was the son of Gene and Phyllis Schuldies. Flynn's parents are Edwin

and Darlene Flynn. They all live in Wheatland.

Both young men were 1984 graduates of Wheatland High School (WHS), and have many friends still in school here.

WHS observed a moment of silence Monday morning in memory of Schuldies and Flynn, according to Principal Lee Beidelman.

"They were both very active kids in school," Beidelman said, adding "they had gobs and gobs of friends.

They were just good around students."

In sports, Beidelman said Schuldies is best remembered for his participation in wrestling. Flynn was active in basketball as well as music.

"It's been a sad day," Beidelman said Monday. "They will be missed."

Nearly everyone in Wheatland, students and staff alike, is expected to attend the funeral this week.

Services for Schuldies were held today at 2 p.m. in the WHS auditorium with Dan Barcus officiating.

School was dismissed for the day at that time, according to Beidelman.

The funeral for Flynn is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. Thursday, Nov. 29 in St. Patrick's Church, Faith Cletus Prado officiating.

Anyone wishing to attend that service will be excused from classes that morning, Beidelman said.
