Mrs. Scott was a charter member of Henry Tisch Circle Ladies of the G.A.R. and a beloved member whose loss is keenly felt by all the members. A long life in which she saw her country through the throes of three wars, being the widow of a Civil war veteran. She had a kindly word for every one and it may be truly said to be like Lincoln in that she lived "with charity for all and malice toward none."

Miss Rebecca Jane Keeton was born at Louisville, Kentucky, October 4, 1850. She departed this life December 29, 1932, being 82 years, three months and 25 days old.

When eleven years old she moved to Keokuk, Iowa, where she was united in marriage to Francis Marion Scott when 19 years of age. Mr. Scott was a soldier in the Civil war on the Union side, Company E, infantry.

To this union were born 8 children four of whom preceded her in death 24 years ago.

Mrs. Scott leaves to mourn her loss four children.

Mrs. E.P. West of Bordeaux, Wyoming with whom she made her home. Kirt Scott of Wheatland, Wyoming, Sherman Scott of Hopkins, Missouri, and Dale Scott of Omaha, Nebraska, also four grandchildren and a host of friends. Mrs. Scott was loved by all who knew her and was a home-loving mother, always sacrificing to make home pleasant for her children and those around her.
