

**SCOTT, THOMAS ALVERY**  
June 6, 1879-February 22, 1931

Thomas Alvery Scott, 51 year old Wheatland Flats farmer, passed away at his home on the Moody farm, 2 miles east of Wheatland, after an illness of only one week, Sunday, February 22, 1931.

Funeral services were held in the Methodist church Tuesday afternoon with Rev. Orman C. King officiating. Interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery with Longwith-Richards Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

Thomas Alvery Scott was born in Fairfield, Mo., St. Clair county, June 6, 1879 and departed this life February 22, 1931 at Wheatland, Wyo.

He was united in marriage to Thursey May Howe at Kansas City, Mo. October 19<sup>th</sup>, 1904. To this union seven children were born, all of whom live in Wheatland.

The family moved from Missouri to Kimball, Nebr. May, 1915 and from Kimball to Wheatland in October, 1917.

Those who survive him are his wife, Mrs. Thursey Scott, seven children, Robert, Hubert, Edward, Albert and Thursey Scott, Mrs. Margaret Pursinger and Mrs. Aileen Maddox, five sisters and one brother in Missouri and four grandchildren.

**NEWS ITEM: Blood Poison Fatal to Thos. A. Scott**

Thomas Avery Scott died here of blood poisoning on Sunday evening about six o'clock. Mr. Scott born June 6, 1879 near Fairfield, Missouri.

He was married to Miss Thursey May How in Kansas City, Missouri in 1904 and to them were born four sons and three daughters, all of whom with the widow survive. The family resided in Missouri and Nebraska until coming to Wyoming in 1917. They live on the Muleshoe Ranch until some two years ago, since which time, they have resided on the farm southeast of town.

Mr. Scott was a kind and loving father and husband. Funeral services were held in the Methodist Church Tuesday afternoon, with Rev. Orman C. King in charge. Burial was made in the Wheatland Cemetery with the Longwith-Richards Funeral Home in charge.
