June 14, 1914-December 5, 1948

Olive Edith Searl was born June 14, 1914 at Sioux City, Iowa and died Sunday, Dec. 5 at the Wheatland hospital.

Miss Searl graduated from Wheatland High School, and was a graduate of the University of Wyoming. She was a member of Phi Tau sorority, and was a member of the Methodist church.

She taught school at Albin, Wyo., and was a deputy Laramie County School Superintendent for a time. During the war, she spent a year and a half with the Red Cross, stationed at El Paso, Texas. Recently she was employed as a stenographer for the Union Pacific railroad in Cheyenne. Four the past four months, she lived in Wheatland.
