

SEDMAN, ROBERT EASTON  
December 19, 1921-May 17, 1980

Robert Easton Sedman, 58, died in Hamilton, Ohio on Saturday, May 17, after a brief illness.

Sedman was born December 19, 1921 in Murdock, Neb. He came to Wheatland with his family in 1929 and was raised and educated here.

He graduated from the Wheatland High School in 1939 and attended the University of Wyoming for a short time. He entered the U.S. Air Force and served during WWII in England with the 374<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron of the 361<sup>st</sup> Fighter Group.

After serving in the military as a pilot for five years, he was discharged with the rank of Major. After his discharge from military duty, he returned to the University of Wyoming to complete his education in engineering.

For over 20 years, he has been associated with the American Standard Company, his job taking him to posts in California and Pennsylvania.

For the past six years, he has been working for the Mosler Safe Co. in Ohio which is a subsidiary of the American Standard Co.

He was a member of the Lindenwald United Methodist Church in Hamilton, Ohio and had been active with the Civil Air Patrol when he lived in California.

He is survived by his wife, Daisy, of Hamilton, Ohio; one daughter, Sandra Lu Yang, of Huntington Beach, Calif.; four grandchildren; his mother Mrs. Mark Havelly of Wheatland and his sister, Mrs. Jim Bookout, also of Wheatland. He was preceded in death by his father, Kenneth Sedman.

Graveside funeral services will be conducted Wednesday, May 21, at 11 a.m. at the Wheatland Cemetery with the Rev. Virgil Lamm officiating.

A Memorial has been established to the American Cancer Society.
