

Arthur Sheldon Dies Tuesday as Result of Freezing

Arthur Sheldon, only son of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Sheldon, died Tuesday.

Arthur, who was employed as a range rider for the Swan Land Co., and while riding December 31, froze his face, hands and feet severely, but made it in to the shearing pens residence where he was treated for the freezing, but as he had been in poor health for the past year, the severe frost bites were too much of shock to his system and he died early Tuesday morning, being found dead in his bed about 10:00 o'clock Tuesday morning by Mr. Smith, bookkeeper at the pens. The body was taken to Laramie by the Albany county coroner and then to Wheatland where he will be buried Friday at 2:00 o'clock from the Watson-Dennis Mortuary.

Arthur, or "Mutt", as he was familiarly called by his friends, was born Nov. 13, 1913, in Wheatland and received his education here. He was an upright young man who will be missed by many. He leaves to mourn his death, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Leo Sheldon, one sister, Mrs. Wm. Dawson, three nieces, Helen, Nellie and Anne Dawson, two uncles, Alfred Sheldon and Don L. Mudd, and one aunt, Mrs. Henry Mullen.
