

## Marvin K. Shue

WHEATLAND — Services for Marvin K. Shue, 59, will be conducted at 2 p.m. Tuesday at the First Christian Church by Dan Driggs, minister. Interment will be in Wheatland Cemetery.

Mr. Shue died July 31, 1993, at the Platte County Memorial Hospital in Wheatland.

He was born Dec. 25, 1933, in Kannapolis, N.C., the son of William Horace and Alice (Parker) Shue Sr. He grew up and was educated in the Kannapolis area. He then worked as an asbestos worker prior to being drafted into the United States Army during the Korean War. Following his discharge, he returned to the Kannapolis area, and his asbestos work.

In 1976, he came to Wheatland where he was associated with the construction of the Missouri Basin Power Project. He retired from construction work in the mid-1980s, and during his retirement years he farmed.

On Jan. 23, 1989, he married June (White) Short in Wendover, Nev. They made their home in Wheatland, where he enjoyed fishing, hunting, playing gin and cooking.

He is survived by his wife of Wheatland; his mother, Alice of Kannapolis; six children, Debbie Seiloff of Cheyenne, Danette Shue of Torrington, Marvin Shue Jr. of California, Kathy Shue of Kentucky, Trenia Shue of North Carolina and Ginger Cozad of Wheatland. One sister, Kay Illick of Orlando, Fla.; three brothers, Colon Shue and Ernest Shue, both of Kannapolis, and William H. Shue Jr. of Florida, and several grandchildren also survive.

He was preceded in death by his father in 1964; one brother, Richard; and one sister, Janice.
