

SHUPP, BESSIE ADELAIDE NOYCE
1886-April 3, 1943

Mrs. Allen H. Shupp passed away last Saturday at the Wheatland hospital where she was taken the previous Monday following a stroke sustained at her home in Wheatland. She had apparently been in good health until the day she was stricken and had taken part in church activities on Sunday. A tireless worker in the church and community, she was held in great respect by all who knew her.

Mrs. Shupp is survived by her husband, three sons, Ralph and Kenneth of Kodiak, Alaska and Franklin of Wheatland, one daughter, Myrna Jean of Wheatland, two brothers and three sisters.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the Congregational Church with Rev. Higby officiating and the Copley funeral home in charge of arrangements. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery.

Bessie Adelaide Noyce was born near Stockton, Kan. April 23, 1886 being the first born of John W. and Carrie Noyce. When still a girl, she joined the Congregational church at Stockton.

Her training to be a teacher included two years at Doane College, Crete, Nebr. where she majored in music. She taught both before and after attending college. On March 30, 1915, she married Allen H. Shupp at Stockton. Four children blessed this union, all of whom survive, also one granddaughter, Ronda Ellen, daughter of Ralph Edwin. The children are Ralph Edwin, now serving in the Civil Service at Kodiak, Alaska, Kenneth Allen in the Coast Guard at Kodiak, Myrna Jean and Frank Noyce, both of Wheatland.

Mr. and Mrs. Shupp came to Wheatland in 1931, residing in this community since that time.
