A few days after having given birth to a strong boy, she was taken with acute inflammatory rheumatism from which endocarditis developed, and the final summons came suddenly. The day before her death she had been up and about the house but her physician warned her that her condition was precarious. Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon from the Lutheran church, Rev. M. T. Schabacker officiating.

Besides the ten little children, Mrs. Simmon leaves a lonesome and loving husband, mother, and two sisters in this vicinity, a brother in Oklahoma, and many friends who know her as a dutiful wife, kind and gentle, an excellent mother, bringing up her children in the fear of God, and she has left a lasting impression on all who knew her.
