

Dwyer Lady Passes Away at Her Home Sunday Morning

Mrs. Cora Anne Snakenberg, wife of Clarence Snakenberg of Dwyer passed away at their home in the Dwyer section Sunday morning at 4:30 from pneumonia.

Funeral services were held from the Wheatland Methodist church on Wednesday afternoon at 1:30 with Cecil V. Smith, pastor of the Christian church performing the last rites. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Watson Mortuary in charge of arrangements.

Cora Anne Campbell was born June 8, 1882 near South English, Ia., Keokuk county. She came to Wyoming in 1913 and for the past two years has lived near Dwyer.

On March 30, 1902 she was married to Clarence Snakenberg in Keota, Iowa. To this union four children were born, Reginold, Jessie, Everett and Mrs. Bertha Shoemaker.
