STEPHENS, LON LEWIS February 28, 1915-November 5, 1967

Funeral services for Lon Stephens, who passed away suddenly on Sunday, November 5, were held from the United Church of Christ Wed., Nov. 8, at 2:00 p.m. with Rev. Clare E. Olney officiating. Mr. Stephens had been principal of the Wheatland Grade and Junior High schools since 1948.

Lon Lewis Stephens was born February 28, 1915 in Helper, Utah. When he was yet a small boy, his family moved to Western Colorado where several family members still reside.

In 1937, he graduated from Mesa College and then taught three years before going into the army as a radio technician. During World War II, he spent four years in the Pacific area where he engaged in several campaigns.
