

STIEBAR, WILLIAM GEORGE
September 8, 1886-October 16, 1918

William Stiebar, son of Mr. and Mrs. Adolph Stiebar, died on Friday, Oct. 11th, after a week's illness from pneumonia following an attack of influenza. Deceased was 32 years of age. He had lived in this vicinity the past eleven years, and was highly respected as a young man and good citizen. In May, 1917, he was married to Miss Edith Campbell. To them, a son was born a few months ago. Because of the quarantine, a public funeral could not be held, but services were conducted Sunday afternoon at the Longwith undertaking parlors, by Rev. J.A. McClellan, and the body was laid to rest by the side of his son in the Wheatland cemetery. Mr. Stiebar had a homestead twelve miles east of town upon which he had completed title, and was making a fine farm home for himself and his family. That his life should be cut off so early is a cause for extreme regret and deep sympathy is extended to the bereaved family.
