

STURGEON, EARL FELIX
May 2, 1909-June 29, 1922

Earl Felix Sturgeon, aged 13, the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Sturgeon, who have lived on a ranch near Owen for a number of years, was dragged to death by his saddle horse, Thursday, June 29. He had ridden to his brother's ranch on the edge of the Laramie plains. While unsaddling his horse the reins, which were tied together, caught in his spur and foot and could not be released until the horse, which had become frightened, had dragged him to death. Earl's father, one brother and a number of other men witnessed the tragedy, but were unable to catch the horse soon enough to save the lad's life. He was an industrious, manly little fellow, loved by his associates and well spoken of by all who knew him, a real boy, lively and full of hope. Interment was made Saturday afternoon on a beautiful mountain side of his father's ranch.
