

TAYLOR, WILLIAM A.
1887-April 19, 1919

Wm. A. Taylor, who had been desperately ill from leakage of the blood vessels, died at the hospital early Saturday morning. Mr. Taylor was the patient upon whom an operation was performed Tuesday of last week for transfusion of blood from one of the hospital nurses. He was in a dying condition prior to the operation and it resulted in an immediate improvement. In fact, the improvement was so marked for four days that the attendants began to hope for recovery, but late Friday night the disease, which more or less had affected all organs of the body, reached his heart and he died in a very short time.

Mr. Taylor was 30 years of age. He was of Scottish parentage, and had no relatives in this country, except a foster sister living in Laramie. He had a brother whom he believed to be with the army in France. He was unmarried, and his home was on a farm south of town on the Sybille. Funeral services were conducted Tuesday by the Masonic lodge, of which he was a member.
