

THOMAS, OSCAR
January 3, 1866-January 3, 1955

Oscar Thomas, a retired railroader and resident of Wheatland for the past six years, died Monday, Jan 3, at a local hospital. Mr. Thomas was 89 years old the day of his death, having been born at Paola, Kans. Jan. 3, 1866.

He is survived by his daughters, Mrs. J.B. King of Wheatland and Mrs. W.S. McRoberts, Temple City, Calif., one grandchild and two great grandchildren.

Mr. Thomas was employed by the Great Northern railroad as an engineer and auditor, had been retired for 19 years. He lived in Eureka, Calif. before coming to Wheatland. He was affiliated with the B.P.O. Elks at Eureka and the O.R.T.C.

Charles Cox, William Watt, Harry Linton, James Angle, A.E. Hoffman and Denzil Blow were pallbearers for the final rites which were held at the Schrader's chapel Thursday afternoon (today) at 2:00 p.m. The Rev. A.L. Stevenson was in charge, and burial was in the local cemetery.
