

TOLLMAN, JAMES A.

James A. Tollman, 72-year old Wheatland resident, was found dead in his bed at his home in the north part of Wheatland, Wednesday morning. Coroner Bert Richards was called and an inquest was held. The verdict was to the effect the deceased had died from heart failure and that he had been dead about nine hours.

Mr. Tollman had not been in the best of health for some time, and evidently knew that his days were numbered as he had told his friends that he expected to pass away shortly.

The deceased came to this section of Wyoming about eight years ago. He worked in the winters as a sheep herder for the King Bros. and early each spring, left for Douglas where he worked each summer and fall.

Very little is known about his people, but his home at one time was at Bendena, Kans., and has a cousin that resides there now. He was a member of the Odd Fellows lodge in the Kansas town. He had been married but we were unable to learn if he is survived by any close relative.

Funeral services were held this afternoon from the Longwith-Richards Funeral Home and burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery.
