

TROYER, SARAH STUTZMAN  
February 17, 1855-August 10, 1914

Sarah Stutzman was born February 17, 1855 and died August 10, 1914, on their homestead one mile west of Bordeaux, Wyoming, being fifty-nine years, five months and twenty-three days of age.

She was married to Mr. Andrew Troyer in the year 1874, to which union seven children were born, all of whom are living and all but one present at the funeral. Their names are as follows: Mr. Willis Troyer, Mrs. Wm. McClean and Mrs. Ray Dickinson, all of Bordeaux, Wyoming; Mrs. C.M. Weatherwax of Lake View; Mrs. B.F. Smith of Torrington; Mrs. Henry Griser of Henry, Nebr.; and Mrs. T.B. Smith of Charlton, Iowa, who on account of sickness was detained from coming home at this time.

Mrs. Troyer had been a great sufferer for several years from a cancer in her left breast, but bore her suffering with marked Christian fortitude until called home last Monday morning at three thirty. She gave herself to her Savior in 1873 and united with the Mennonite church, of which communion she was a member until she was called home.

The last sad rites were held at the home on Tuesday at eleven a.m., conducted by Rev. R.F. Paxton of the Congregational church of Wheatland, after which the weary body was laid to rest in "God's Acre" south of town. The bereaved husband who has lost the companion of his life for more than two score years, as well as all the children and grandchildren, have the deepest sympathy of all the community. "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord".
