

TUCKER, FINIS  
February 22, 1886-February 7, 1946

Finis Tucker, 59, was found dead at his home last Thursday following a heart attack. He had been a resident of this community for the past thirty years coming here from Oklahoma. He was a retired farmer and had been making his home in town while his son attended the local high school. Mr. Tucker was one of the earlier settlers here and charter member of the Antelope Gap Grange, serving on the Executive Committee since its organization.

He is survived by his son, John; four daughters, Mrs. Cleta Beran, Mrs. Hazel Brecht and Mrs. Mildred Simmons of Wheatland and Mrs. Dorothy Delbert of Wheeling, W. Va.; two brothers, J.D. Tucker of Wheatland and N.E. Tucker of Eads, Colo.; one sister, Mrs. Ella Reed of Kiowa, Kan. His wife and two sons preceded him in death.

Funeral services were held Sunday at the Christian church with Mr. J.E. McElroy officiating. Pallbearers were Oscar Throckmorton, Earl Romig, Charles Campbell, Ira Johnson, Albert Weber and Homer Curtis. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with Schrader Funeral home in charge of arrangements.
