

**TUCKER, ISAAC NEWTON**

**April 29, 1851-June 1, 1930**

Isaac Newton Tucker, who has made Wheatland his home for the past 9 years, passed away at his home here, Sunday, June 1<sup>st</sup>, after a short illness. At the time of his death, Mr. Tucker was 79 years of age.

Isaac Newton Tucker was born at Ottumwa, Iowa, April 29<sup>th</sup>, 1851 and departed this life at his late home in Wheatland, Wyo., June 1<sup>st</sup>, 1930, being at the time of his death, 79 years, 1 month and 3 days of age.

In 1872 he was united in marriage to Miss Alice Pardee who preceded him in death, July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1922. To this union five children were born, four of whom remain to mourn his loss.

In 1880 the family moved to Barber county, Kansas, leaving there for Woods county, Okla., in 1894, and from there to Wheatland in 1921, where he has since made his home.

Thirty-eight years ago he made a profession of faith in Christ as his personal Savior and united with the United Brethren church where he remained a faithful member until a few years after coming to Wheatland when he and his second wife were affiliated with the Baptist church.

On May 10<sup>th</sup>, 1924, he married Mrs. Fanny Wagner of Wheatland and remained a true and faithful companion until death overtook him.

He leaves to mourn his death his wife, Mrs. Fanny Tucker, three sons, J.D. Tucker, N.E. Tucker and Finis Tucker, all of Wheatland, and one daughter, Mrs. A.J. Reed of Kiowa, Kan., twenty-four grandchildren and nine great grandchildren; one brother, John Tucker of Buffalo, Okla., three sisters, Mrs. James Osborn of Illinois, Mrs. W.M. Dunham of Wheatland, and Mrs. Laura Lamb of Honolulu, Hawaii, and a host of other relatives and friends.
