The finding of a water logged human body caught on a riffle of the North Laramie river on the old Fowler ranch six miles above the Guernsey dam was the occasion of a trip by county coroner, N.J.N. McCallum to that place Monday.

The body was located Monday by the present owner of the ranch, Charles Frederick, who hauled the remains ashore, and wired McCallum. The latter found the body in an extreme state of decomposition, the flesh having dropped entirely from the head, so that identification was practically impossible. The body was that of a man approximately five feet nine or ten inches tall, clad in a blue sweater, two blue shirts, two pairs of overalls and underwear. The recognizable contents of his pockets were two dollar bills, a jack knife, and a small paper, apparently a cross word puzzle.
