

# Everett William Waln

*December 21, 1921 – January 18, 2006*

Graveside services and inurnment for lifetime resident of Wheatland and Platte County, Everett William Waln, 84, were conducted at 11 a.m., Saturday, Jan. 21 in the Wheatland Cemetery with Pastor Skip Perry of the United Methodist Church officiating.

He died Wednesday, Jan. 18, 2006, at the Life Care Center in Cheyenne.

Everett was born Dec. 21, 1921, in Wheatland, the son of Gladys (Turner) and George T. Waln. He was reared and educated in Wheatland,

graduating from Wheatland High School in 1940. Everett married Barbara Alice Hudson on Aug. 8, 1941, in Harrisburg, Neb. He served in the United States Navy during World War II. Upon his honorable discharge, he returned to Wyoming and farmed in the Antelope Gap area from 1948 - 1957. He then owned and operated Waln Livestock Trucking for a time before working for the Wheatland Irrigation District and retiring as manager. During retirement he and his wife traveled and he raised sheep. He enjoyed having coffee with his friends.

Survivors include two children and their spouses, Donald E. Waln and wife, Merrily, of Bakersfield, Calif. and Rebecca Jean Anderson and husband, Kenneth A., of Littleton, Colo.; four grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; wife of 50 years on Sept. 6, 1991; and his oldest grandson, Bradley.
