

Hazel Pearl Weber

Funeral services for Hazel Pearl Weber, 90, were held Tuesday, Aug. 13, at 2 p.m. at the Wheatland Bible Church, with pastors Gordon Swedburg, Delbert Dick and Tim Brom officiating. Interment followed in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Weber died Friday, Aug. 9 at the Platte County Memorial Hospital Nursing Wing in Wheatland.

She was born Jan. 21, 1901 in Webster County, Neb., the daughter of John and Britta Lena (Anderson) Anderson. She was reared and educated in Nebraska.

They moved to Wheatland, and homesteaded in the Antelope Gap and Gray Rocks areas of Platte County in 1927. She taught Sunday school and belonged to the Grange, where she served as an officer.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, seven brothers, George, Victor, John, Harry, Roy, Ray and Wayne Anderson, and five sisters, Ida Anderson, Etta Derr, Alice Kline, Ellen Thomas and Selma Kershner.
