Flora May Smith was born in Des Moines, Iowa, Aug. 21, 1883, and moved to Michigan Valley, Kans. when a baby. Here she spent her girlhood and attended school, and on May 26, 1901, she became the wife of Joseph M. Wickam.

In February, 1905, the family moved to Wyoming and has lived in and around Wheatland since that time.

Mrs. Wickam was taken ill on July 15, and died on Aug. 19, 1936, just two days before she would have reached her fifty-third birthday.

She leaves to mourn her loss, her husband, Joseph M. Wickam, three daughters, Mrs. M.C. Short, Mrs. Ross Shepherd, and Miss Esther Wickam, all of Wheatland; three sons, Leo of Riverton, Wyo., and Fred and Sammie of Wheatland; her mother, Mrs. M.D. Smith of Wheatland; one sister, Mrs. W.E. Rogers of Armarillo, Tex., and one brother, Merl Smith of Denver, Colo., three grandsons and one granddaughter, besides a host of close friends.

Mrs. Wickam was a member of the Order of Eastern Star, Methodist-Episcopal church, W.T.C.U., Second Division of the Ladies Aid of the M.E. church and president of the Ladies Aid of that church.

Mrs. Wickam was one of the best-loved ladies in this community. Her cheerful and charming personality will long be remembered by her many friends, and the profusion of floral tributes at her bier testified to the esteem in which she was held.
