

WILDE, ANTHONY

Anthony Wilde commenced life in Pittsburgh, Penn., and died at his home in Hartville, Wednesday morning, May 15<sup>th</sup>, at the age of 61 years and 9 months. The deceased was a pioneer in Wyoming, and as age advanced, disposed of his ranch on the Laramie, and moved to Hartville where he held the office of mayor for a number of terms.

The funeral ceremony was held under the auspices of the Eagles' lodge, of which the deceased was a member. A special train was chartered and the remains were taken to Wheatland Saturday where they were laid to rest. Rev. F. J. Chipp of Wheatland officiated.

The deceased leaves a wife and a large family of children; also two brothers and one sister to mourn his death. The entire community expresses sympathy to the family in the time of their sad bereavement.

Our citizens were surprised on Wednesday morning to learn that Anthony Wilde of Hartville, had been found dead in his bed at his home at above place. Mr. Wilde was in his usual good health when he retired on Tuesday night, and the cause of his death is given as heart trouble.

The town election occurred at Hartville on Tuesday, and as Mr. Wilde always took an active part in the public affairs of his community, it is thought the excitement incident to the usual lively elections held at Hartville was probably to a certain extent responsible for the attack of heart trouble.

Mr. Wilde was well known in this section, being one of the early residents. He was a brother of Joe Wilde, of Ft. Laramie, and is also survived by a wife, two daughters- Mrs. H.W. Meglemre of Wheatland and Mrs. A.J. McGinty of Hudson, and a son, Wm. Wilde of Ft. Laramie.

The remains will be shipped to Wheatland and interment will take place here on Saturday.
