**Mrs. Jacob Wilhelm,  
Jr., 44 years, Dies  
Thursday, July 13**

**Funeral Services Are  
Conducted Sunday  
Afternoon**

Mrs. Jacob Wilhelm, Sr., 44 year old Wheatland woman, passed away at her home Thursday evening at about 10 o'clock. Mrs. Wilhelm had been in good health until the evening prior to her demise.

Funeral services were held from the home at 1:30 and at 2 o'clock they were conducted from the Bethlehem Evangelical church by Rev. G.T. Zucher. The services were in both German and English. The church choir and Ladies Aid rendered beautiful music. The Copley Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements and interment took place in the Wheatland cemetery.

Mrs. Jacob Wilhelm, nee Elizabeth Ott, was born in Schoendorf in the German Volga settlement in Russia, December 14, 1888. There she was baptized as a little child and confirmed in her Christian faith when she was 14 years old.

In 1906 she became the wife of Jacob Wilhelm and both came to this country in 1913. They lived together 15 years at Longmont, Colo., and made their home at Wheatland since 1928.

They were blessed with 13 children of who two died early, one in Russia and the other in Longmont. The children that survive their mother are: Jake, Jr., Mrs., Katherine Wilhelm, Emma, Alvin, Elsie, Herman, Frieda, Victor, Irene, Charlene and Edward John. She is also survived by her husband, 3 sisters and 1 brother, the latter four live in the old country. It is also thought her father is also alive in Russia.

She was born in Russia, coming to American some twenty years ago and to the Wheatland community about five years ago. A tiny baby came to keep her company to the Spirit land. and was laid in her arms when she went to her final rest. Funeral services were conducted at the German Congregational church with Rev. Zucher in charge and burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery Sunday afternoon, Copley Funeral home in charge. Her husband and eleven children mourn the loss of their best friend as she lies so quietly with tired hands folded about the little form of her baby. The children left are Jacob, Kathleen, Emma, Alvin, Elsie, Herman, Freda, Victor, Irene, Charlene, and Edward.
