George F. Williams, well known local merchant, succumbed in the Platte County Memorial Hospital on February 4, 1965, following an extended illness.

Mr. Williams was born in Scottsville, Mo. on September 20, 1894. He grew up in Browning, Mo., went to Kansas City at the age of 18 as a merchant and attended business school in Quincy, Ill. He was married to Doris Rinehart in Browning in November of 1919.
