

WILSON, JAMES P.
September 16, 1896-November 3, 1918

On November 4th the sad news was received that James P. Wilson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Wilson, of the North Laramie, had died at Ft. McArthur, San Pedro, Calif. He had scarcely arrived at camp when he contracted the influenza from which he died in just a few days.

The deceased was born near Wheatland, Wyo., Sept. 16th, 1896. He was christened in the Methodist church when a child of two years. He was a hard working, industrious young man and a perfect man physically. Wheatland and vicinity had always been his home.

He leaves a father, mother seven brothers and two sisters to mourn his decease. He was a private in Co. A., 2nd A.A.T.K.

Funeral services were conducted from the Pepper Mortuary by the pastor of the family, Rev. McClellan. Private Wilson was buried in the Wheatland cemetery Nov. 12th with due military honors by members of the Home Guards.
