

J. F. Winters, Father Of Nine Children Dies Here Sunday

John F. Winters, 39-year old Wheatland Flats farmer, died here, Sunday, September 28th.

Funeral services were held from the Congregational church, Wednesday afternoon with a Greeley, Colo., pastor preaching the German service. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Watson Mortuary in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Winters came to the Wheatland district two years ago from Colorado and has farmed one of the W. L. Ayers places west and south of town. He is survived by his wife and nine children.

Mrs. Clyde Woolsey Fatal
Burned in Gas Explosion
Death Occurs Fifteen Hours After
Explosion which Partially Wrecked H

One of the most tragic accidents to occur in this section in years took place at the home of Mrs. Clyde Woolsey in Wheatland on Wednesday morning at eight o'clock when an explosion from a gas stove partially wrecked the Woolsey home and burned Mrs. Woolsey to death. Her death took place on Wednesday night about 11 o'clock.

Mrs. Woolsey had been working some window curtains in a room at the time the explosion took place in the part of the house and had just finished her work and the window by which she was working had just been closed and she had just entered the room when an explosion took place which blew out the entire side of the room and the part of the house in the explosion a chimney of several feet the ceiling falling to the floor. The result was that Mrs. Woolsey was about the body of her mother Mrs. I. Richardson, who had been down to the Woolsey home, was also badly burned about the hands and arms in attempting to extinguish the flames which surrounded her mother. Her wounds were immediately taken to the Wheatland hospital for treatment but the patient succumbed to the wounds on a bench in the hospital and her death was reported in the Wheatland Standard on Wednesday.
