

Mrs. C.V. Woolsey, Pioneer Resident of Community Dies April 12

Mrs. C.V. Woolsey passed away very suddenly from a heart attack at her home in Wheatland, Sunday, April 12 at 4:30 p.m. She had been a resident of Wheatland and community since 1908. Annie Maud Gordon was born on January 2, 1873 in Seafoss, Maryland and moved to Kansas

in 1899, On January 24 of that same year she was united in marriage to C.V. Woolsey and to this union four children were born. In 1908 Mr. and Mrs. Woolsey and family moved from Kansas to Wheatland, where they have made their home since that time. She was affiliated with the First Christian Church of Wheatland by letter on March 1, 1925. Funeral services were held at 3:00 p.m. Wednesday afternoon from the Christian Church with Rev. H.N. Waddell officiating. Interment was made in the Wheatland Cemetery with the Watson and Dennis Home For Funerals in charge of arrangements. Mrs. Woolsey is survived by her husband, C.V. Woolsey, four children Thelma, George G. and Boyd C. of Wheatland and Daisy V. Osborn of Buffalo, also one sister Mrs. Daisy Crunkelton of Greencastle, Pennsylvania, two brothers, Bruce Gordon of Greencastle, Pennsylvania and V.R.
