

WRIGHT, ELTON WARREN
1912-October 3, 1947

Warren Wright, 34, of Denver and formerly of Wheatland, died Friday, October 3, at St. Joseph's hospital in Denver.

Wright was born in Wheatland and was graduated from the University of Wyoming. He was employed for a time with the state board of equalization, and from 1942 until 1945, was employed in Denver by the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph company. In 1945, he was transferred to Denver as a member of the public relations department. At the time of his death, he was assistant editor of "The Monitor", a company publication. He was formerly employed by the O.P. Skaggs store and the Grease Spot in Wheatland. He was a director of the Denver advertising club, the Rotary club, and several telephone company organizations.

Survivors include his wife and two children, Caroline and David, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Orlando Wright of Ft. Laramie; a sister, Mrs. M.C. McKelvy of Denver; and three brothers, E.C. Wright of Laramie, Melvin Wright of McCook, Nebr. and Morris Wright of Wheatland.

Funeral services were held Saturday in Denver with graveside rites held at two o'clock on Monday in Wheatland. The Rev. Carl N. Last officiated here.
